The EAROPH Indonesia Chapter is focusing on regeneration of members and involving the young planners. It was decided that the Indonesian Association of Urban and Regional Planners (IAP) would play a larger role in executing EAROPH activities in Indonesia, with the support of the government institutions.

2. List of Activities 2010-2011

IAP Most Livable City Index Indonesia

The Indonesian Association of Urban and Regional Planners (IAP) held the Most Livable City Index (MLCI) survey of 15 large cities in Indonesia. The survey showed the mean index of perception of comfort is 54.26. The highest ranking city perceived to be most livable is Yogyakarta (66,52), followed by Denpasar (63,63). The lowest ranking city is Medan (46,67) and Pontianak (46.92). The MLC Index is used as input for municipalities to improve infrastructure and services.

Governing Council UN-Habitat

The Government of Indonesia attended the 23rd UN-Habitat Governing Council in Nairobi, Kenya April 11-15, 2011. The theme of the 23rd UN-Habitat Governing Council was Sustainable Urban Development through Expanding Equitable Access to Land, Housing, Basic Services and Infrastructure. During the Governing Council, the Minister of Housing made a statement as Chairman of the Third Bureau of the Asia Pacific Ministerial Conference of Housing and Urban Development (APMCHUD) and on behalf of the Republic of Indonesia. The governments, which approved the work programme and budget of UN-Habitat for the coming two years, also gave the Executive Director, Dr. Joan Clos, the green light to begin preparations for a Habitat III meeting in the year 2016. Before the Governing Council, the 2nd Meeting of the Third Bureau of APMCHUD was hosted by the Chairman of the Third Bureau in Nairobi, attended by bureau members from Iran, Irak, India, Fiji, Jordan dan Korea.



2nd International Young Planners Forum (IYPF) Yogyakarta, 13-15 July, 2011 Theme: The End of Cities

The International Young Planners Forum (IYPF), was first established in 2010 at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. IYPF is a forum that promotes knowledge sharing, intense discussions and network development among young planners in the Asia Pacific region. The IYPF emphasizes the importance of building common ground of understanding, developing mutual relations and stimulating regeneration of planners.



The 2nd International Young Planners Forum was held in Yogyakarta, July 13-15th, 2011 with the theme 'The End of Cities'. The event was organized by the Indonesian Association of

Urban and Regional Planners (IAP) and the Malaysian Institute of Planners (MIP), and supported by EAROPH Indonesia. The 2nd IYPF was attended by 140 participants from 5 countries: Australia, India, Malaysia, Singapore and Indonesia. After a two-day conference to exchange views and experience on the planning system, discuss the future of cities and roadmap for the role of young planners in sustainable urban development. The participants agreed on the Yogyakarta Action Plan on the commitment of young planners to support sustainable urban development and conduct the International Young Planners Forum every two years

National Housing Day Commemoration

National Housing Day in Indonesia is celebrated each year on August 25. The Ministry of Housing, Real Estate Indonesia, Association of Housing Developers and National Housing Corporation organized a series of activities to promote cooperation and synergy amongst national and local governments in low-income housing development. The Adiupaya Puritama Award was awarded to stakeholders (local governments, national banks, housing associations) that played a significant contribution to housing development in Indonesia. The award was presented on September 22, 2011.

World Habitat Day Celebrations

The Ministry of Public Works, Ministry of Housing and Provincial Government of South Sulawesi supported by the Habitat Indonesia National Secretariat hosted the commemoration of World Habitat Day in Indonesia. The ceremony was held in Jakarta on 3 October, 2011 at the Vice-President's Palace and in Makassar, 14-16 October 2011. The WHD theme Cities and Climate Change, was brought to the Indonesian context with the sub-theme: Green Cities, Solution for Climate Change. The World Habitat Day commemoration included a series of seminars/workshops for green cities and slum alleviation, national drawing competition for elementary students and undergraduates, national essay competition for high-school students and undergraduates, national essay competition for journalists, and photo competition for the public. In Makassar, more than 30.000 people participated in the fun bike event on October 16th, 2011. The People's Festival was held in Losari Park and supported by an exhibition on efforts to promote adaptation for climate change, arts and crafts, and music concert. World Town Planning Day Celebrations

The World Town Planning Day commemoration is organized by the Directorate of Spatial Planning, Ministry of Public Works and supported by the Sustainable Urban Development Forum Indonesia (SUD-fi) to promote empowerment of stakeholders for Green Cities. A series of seminars and discussions were held up till 8 November 2011. The Action Plan for Green Cities was signed by 60 cities and regencies on 14 October 2011.

Policy Dialogue For High Level Administrative Policy Makers On Establishing Security Policy Of North Coastal Jakarta Due To Climate Related To Disaster Risk

The Policy Dialogue will be held in Jakarta, 24 November 2011, and involve policy makers (government officials, researchers and other stakeholders) at the national, regional and local level. It aims to identify knowledge gaps in climate change, integrate urban planning with climate change adaptation and draft a collaborative action plan on integrating climate change adaptation with urban planning. Speakers for this policy dialogue are Prof. Ken Lowry (Chair, Dept. of Urban and Regional Planning, Univ. of Hawaii), Prof. Sofwan Hadi (Bandung Institute of Technology) and Ir. Sarwo Handayani, MSi (Jakarta Planning and Development Agency).
