

Brief History of Himeji

- 564 Harima Grand Shrine was established.
- 734 Kibi no Makibi founded the Hiromine Shrine on Mt. Hiromine.
- 741 Harima Kokubunji Temple was established.
- 966 Buddhist Saint Shohku founded the Engyoji Temple on Mt. Shosha.
- 1581 Hideyoshi builds Himeji Castle. A three-story Tenshukaku was completed.
- 1609 Himeji Castle with its five-story, six-floor Tenshukaku was completed.
- 1888 Sanyo Railroad was linked Kobe and Himeji
- 1889 Himeji City Government was launched (city area of 3.03 km² and population of 24,958); the city hall was founded.
- 1939 Nippon Steel Corporation began productions in Himeji.
- 1945 A large portion of the city was destroyed in air raids, followed by WW II.
- 1955 Ohtemae Avenue was completed.
- 1964 Himeji Castle's "Great Renovation of the Showa Era" was completed.
- 1972 Shinkansen, or the bullet train of Japan, began services.
- 1983 Himeji City Museum of Art was opened.
- 1989 Himeji Centennial Festival "Shirotopia" was held.
- 1990 Japan Castle Research Center was opened.
- 1992 "Kohko-en" Garden was opened.










